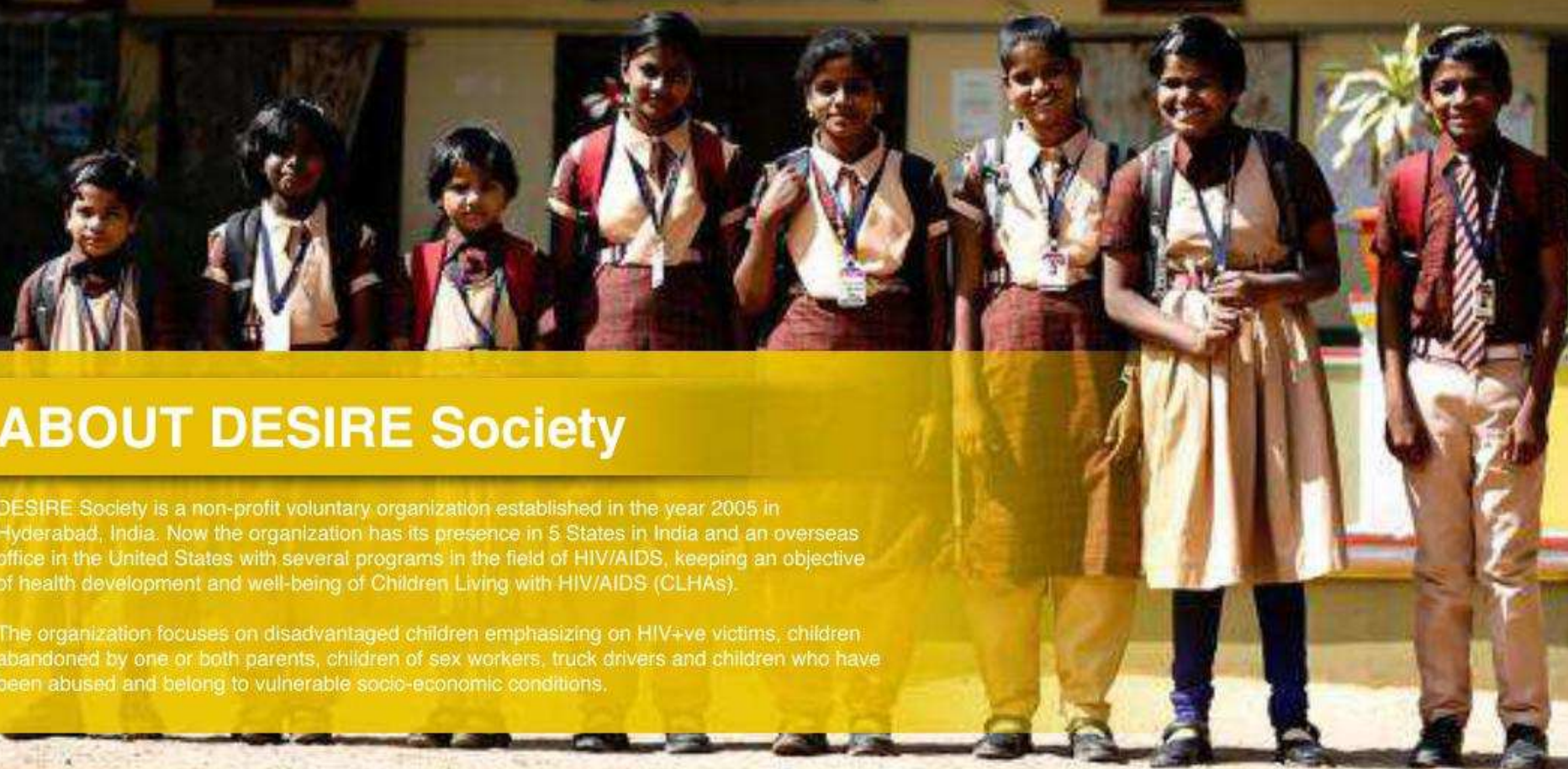

ABOUT DESIRE Society

DESIRE Society is a non-profit voluntary organization established in the year 2005 in Hyderabad, India. Now the organization has its presence in 5 States in India and an overseas office in the United States with several programs in the field of HIV/AIDS, keeping an objective of health development and well-being of Children Living with HIV/AIDS (CLHAs).

The organization focuses on disadvantaged children emphasizing on HIV+ve victims, children abandoned by one or both parents, children of sex workers, truck drivers and children who have been abused and belong to vulnerable socio-economic conditions.

VISION

Our vision is to reduce the stigma and discrimination associated with HIV/AIDS and lessen the death cases among the people living with HIV/AIDS in India.

MISSION

The mission of DESIRE Society is to improve the lives of children struggling with the impact of the HIV/AIDS pandemic in India. We provide shelter, food, treatment, education and psycho-social support to help these victims achieve their full life potential.

AIM

Our Aim is to reduce the spread of HIV and meet the challenges in the field of AIDS. We are committed to preventing HIV infection, facilitating access to treatment, care and support and lessening the impact of AIDS.

OBJECTIVES

DESIRE Society

To reduce the morbidity and mortality of the CLHAs (Children Living with HIV/AIDS) is the main objective of this project.

To offer stigma free voluntary counseling and treatment facilities for CLHAs

To help CLHAs access antiretroviral (ARV) drugs from Govt & monitor them for drug adherence.

To support orphans and vulnerable children infected and affected with HIV/AIDS through Institutional Care Homes (ICH)

To advocate for stigma free living society for children living with HIV/AIDS



WHY DESIRE Society

All the programs of DESIRE Society cover an important section of reducing child mortality rate which is a part of Schedule VII of Companies Act, 2013, India. Since its inception, DESIRE Society is exclusively dedicated for saving lives of the children suffering with HIV/AIDS and it has gained more than a decade of expertise in the area. Now, India is second largest country with more than two million people suffering with HIV/AIDS and around 150000 children estimated are HIV+ and there is no permanent cure for HIV/AIDS yet. The organization is addressing issues of such children who are suffering because of their parents' ignorance and guiding them to dream for future.

Future of the children: As we have been advancing medically in the area of HIV/AIDS around the world, life expectancy of HIV+ is getting increased. In India we have seen people lived beyond 30 years from the date of HIV infection. Now we believe at DESIRE Society by offering timely treatment with nutritious diet and homely environment with parental care can help our children to live beyond this expectancy. We also provide education leading to employment and enabling children to get married for family establishment. As we are aware that we can prevent HIV transmission from the parent to child (there is 99% success rate in India), we understand that children supported by DESIRE Society are also equally eligible to get married. We are committed to care next generation kids as well if their parents cannot survive.

OUR PROGRAMS

(A) Institutional Care Home (ICH)

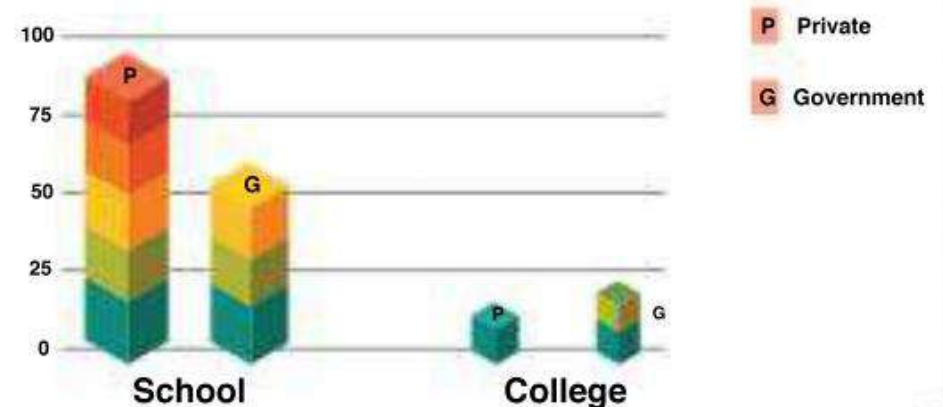
The program has been committed to provide Shelter, Food & Nutrition, Medical care and Educational needs of the children along with moral support for holistic care and development. The program was started in 2005 in Hyderabad for the need to develop a comprehensive and sustainable response to treatment of CLHAs. The program is in 6 locations now with 350 children which contributes to high-prevalence states in India like Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Noida (Delhi NCR). The program focuses on disadvantaged children emphasizing on HIV+ve victims, children abandoned by one or both parents, children of sex workers, truck drivers and children who have been abused and belong to poor socio economic conditions.

At the time of admission to ICH most of the children were found in pathetic conditions. Extreme malnourishment and OIs were prevalent. However soon after making ICH their home the children have improved with holistic care and attention provided. A diet chart focusing on a nutritious and protein rich diet is adhered to on a daily basis for the Food & Nutrition requirements. Malnourishment has been completely cured and no child at ICH is underweight anymore. A full time doctor is available for everyday checkups and drug administration. A specialized counsellor attends to them on one to one, group and gender specific sessions on a weekly basis. Every child's profile and medical record is documented. Majority of the children are admitted in private schools and colleges. The children receive after school support from the elder inmates. The success of this program can also be attributed to the happiness, love and affection they receive at ICH from the team and inmates which indirectly boosts their health and immunity.

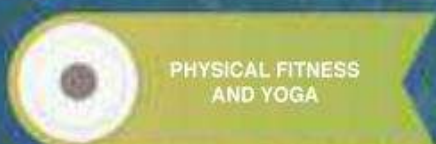

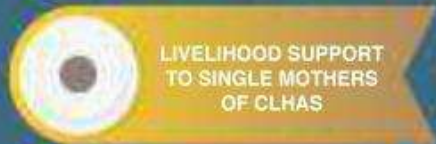

CHALLENGE

School admission into private institutions in smaller cities is next to impossible in spite of paying 100% fees due to social stigma. Though our team takes on the mammoth task of finding a school in such locations, there is a need for people to gain awareness on the issue and how their support can give them everyday life and hope for future.



(B) CHILD NUTRITION AND HEALTH CARE

The first step to treatment of HIV/AIDS is to be aware of the status. As a way to reach out to large number of children who have not been tested and who could be potential carriers of the virus we started Child Nutrition and Health Care program. We conduct health camps in various locations in the city and rural areas to detect the virus and counsel them to manage the disease. The program reaches to 900 children from various locations. These are the children who have their parents and guardians and living along with their family members in the communities.

The Health Camps are conducted every month and the record of every child attending the camp is documented. An Outreach Worker (ORW) is also placed in every location to monitor at all times. The Health Camps also in a way creates awareness and tries to break the stigma associated with HIV/AIDS

(C) SUMMER CAMPS

CLHAs have additional factors in complexity of their illness and are at a greater risk of psychiatric problems including depression, anxiety and feelings of isolation. Interdisciplinary approach catering to their medical, mental health and social welfare is needed. Most of the CLHAs are left out from family gatherings and celebrations. With this in mind DESIRE Society initiated Summer Camps as an annual social event which is a complete fun based recreational gathering meant exclusively for children suffering with HIV/AIDS. All the ICH children and other CLHAs from communities take part in it.

It was initiated in the year 2009 in Hyderabad and since then it has been an annual event of fun and frolic across all locations. Cultural, Art, Magic shows, Workshops, Yoga, Camel ride, etc are part of the 3-4 days Camps during the months of April- June across 6 locations in India. Efforts are made to make this experience as safe as possible through constant supervision. We provide accommodation, food and medical assistance during the event to all the CLHAs who attend the camps. They are also given nutritional supplements, books and stationary at the end of the event. Children show great enthusiasm in attending the event every year.

ADILAKSHMI

Adilakshmi infected HIV virus through her mother during her birth. She lost her parents to the same disease. Adilakshmi's family belongs to poor economic conditions, her father being a cobbler. Adilakshmi struggled in her initial days when she was admitted at the Care Home. She cried all the time due to her unsupported health condition. However within few weeks at the Care Home things started to change for her. She received care and treatment by our medical staff. She is able to get ART which is the only medicine available to increase the lifespan of an HIV infected person. Now she plays with her fellow inmates and is able to have food from time to time.

Here, one thing is very clear that proper nutrition and timely medical care (with ART) brought change in her life. Now Adilakshmi's living condition moved from extreme sorrow to happiness and she aims to be a Software Engineer.

PARAS

Paras is among the thousands of children who are HIV infected through Mother to Child transmission. He has a twin brother and a younger sister. Paras lost his mother due to AIDS when he was 6 years. His father couldn't take care of them due to his deteriorating health because he was HIV +ve. Paras along with his brother and sister were admitted at DESIRE Society Care Home at Noida.

The primary task of nutritive food was well planned and given as per diet chart at Care Home. The healthcare is prime concern and he is regularly put on ART medication. The balance of food and medical care has improved the overall well being of this boy. Paras is one of our most disciplined children and is quite obedient while undertaking daily routine schedules. In spite of shifting from a Government school to English medium private school he has been scoring well and the general knowledge he has at his age is quite impressive. He wants to be the topper of his class and we at DESIRE Society are committed to give our best to realize his dreams.

Child like Paras is a role model to their peers when it comes to discipline in medical care and education.

Baby Ramya was infected with HIV during birth. She had lost both her parents to AIDS. She came to live with her paternal grandmother in a small village. However, stricken by poverty and deprived of medical care and love Ramya's condition showed no improvement. These unsupported circumstances left the baby with uncertainty on her further survival. At that time, she used to attend the Nutrition Camps by DESIRE Society to receive her regular supplementary nutrition kit. Seeing her extremely malnourished DESIRE Society enquired of her situation and offered admission at ICH, Bengaluru to provide care and support needed to improve her condition. Hence baby Ramya got an opportunity of sharing her feelings, emotions and joys with her 33 more such inmates at ICH, Bengaluru.

What DESIRE Society did for Ramya:

Since June 2011 when Ramya was admitted, DESIRE Society has been rendering its best for the quality and extended life span. At the time of admission she was extremely malnourished and desperately needed medical attention. Her CD4 count was 200 cells/micro L and the normal level should be at 1500 cells/micro L (according to WHO). She was offered proper counseling, treatment and medicines for preventing OIs by our medical team. She is also able to receive round the clock health care and monitoring. Ramya was put on ART as her CD4 count was low. She requires a balanced diet as ART has got more **side effects**. Exactly here DESIRE Society has put more attention on planned nutritional diet which helped this baby to continue drug adherence and lead her to gain weight and improve height. After such continuous efforts by DESIRE, Ramya's health condition is getting stable and heading progress. Now her CD4 count is raised to 759 cells/micro L. Improved health condition has blessed her to resume her education. Now she is in 10th standard at Jambusavare Government school close to DESIRE Society Care Home. "I want to become a doctor when I grow up and wish to serve my village people" are the words of **Ramya**. We at DESIRE Society hope Ramya should live long and may her dreams come true like a normal child.

Ramya is one among thousands of such children suffering with HIV/AIDS in India. DESIRE Society was born to support such children through providing comprehensive care with social security. The organization shall continue its sincere services to make lives of these children happy till they live on this earth.

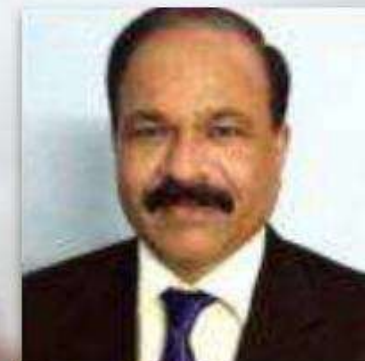



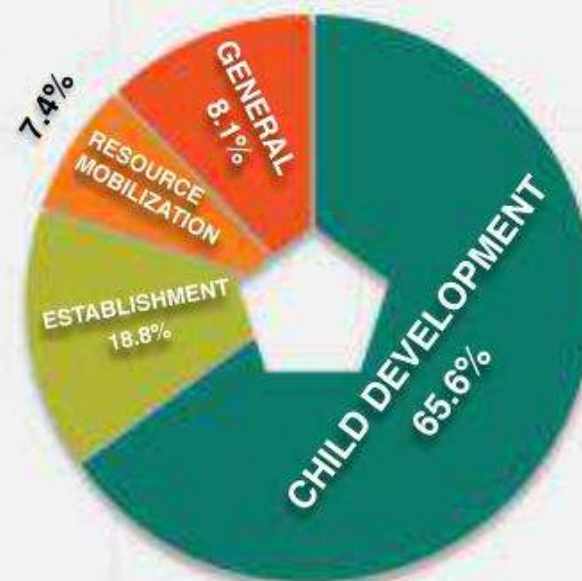
